Article 19, Section 6 of the Nevada Constitution is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 6. Limitation on initiative making appropriation or requiring expenditure of money. This Article does not permit the proposal of any statute or statutory amendment which makes an appropriation or otherwise requires the expenditure of money, unless such statute or amendment also imposes a sufficient tax, not prohibited by the Constitution, or otherwise constitutionally provides for raising the necessary revenue.

The limitation in this Section does not apply to the proposal of any initiative that would amend the Nevada Constitution, however, if any potential appropriation or expenditure of money may result from such an initiative, the description of effect for the initiative shall include the following language: 'This initiative petition may require an appropriation or otherwise require the expenditure of money.'
